Towpath Repairs

OWPC have been working with the Canal and River Trust to progress repairs to the towpath, specifically the area near the "Iron Bridge" between Passmore and Woughton Park. We hope to affect these in July and continue to seek volunteers to help. If anyone is able to offer the use of a toilet within a 10 minute walk of this area, it would be most helpful. The necessary tasks can be suited to your strength and ability, so please come and join us. We will publish the date when we have it, as this has to be co-ordinated with C&RT.

Business at Home

Over the years many residents within our parish have undertaken to run their own businesses from home. It has come to our attention that MKC is keen to enforce specific planning regulations regarding this, so we felt it would be helpful to publish an overview of these. This way any resident who already runs a business from home, or anyone planning to start such a business, is kept informed of the planning permissions necessary, which generally concern issues of change of use.

The following is taken from the MKC Planning section of their website:

If the answer to any of the following questions is 'yes', then permission will probably be needed:

- Will your home no longer be used mainly as a private residence?
- Will your business result in a marked rise in traffic or people calling?
- Will your business involve any activities unusual in a residential area?
- Will your business disturb your neighbours at unreasonable hours or create other forms of nuisance such as noise or smells?
