# **Parish Budget**

At the meeting on 8th January your Parish Council unanimously voted a budget for next year that is based on this year's expenditure. This means that the Precept will stay the same – for the 4th year in a row and your local tax will stay approximately the same. We can do this because we keep our operating costs, including the allotments, under tight control. We continue to be one of the lowest taxing parishes in Milton Keynes.

### The Canal in Our Parish

As many of you will be aware, the Parish Council has a list of willing volunteers who are prepared to turn out each month and work on the towpath. Gradually it is being repaired with the help and support of the Canal and River Trust (C&RT). We have been labouring for just over 12 months and are proud to announce that we have won the VORA Shield for the current year. This is the Volunteer Organisation Recognition Award for the SE England area of the C&RT. Congratulations to all who have participated in this venture. The shield will be placed in Ye Olde Swan Inn should you wish to see it, no doubt the landlord will be pleased to see you!



#### **Bushes and Trees**

In this Parish we are fortunate to have so much greenery and space around us. We have a rural atmosphere while being almost in the centre of the city. However it is a continual struggle to keep the trees and bushes in order with pruning and cutting back. Unfortunately, on 16th December 2017, the MKC Regulatory Committee turned down our application to register the Orchard as a village green. Both MKC (the landowner) and the Parks Trust (the lessee) had objected on legal grounds. This is very disappointing because almost 100 residents had completed evidence forms in support. We will not let this set back, nor those of the Playing Fields and the Paddocks, deter us from future action to protect these open spaces. Watch this space

# **Dog Walkers**

Recently OWPC has received reports of dog mess being left around in the parish, usually just in the grass. We have many dog owners in this beautiful area and many of us enjoy walking through the countryside. We know that most of you clear up after your dogs and we applaud you for your efforts. Please may we encourage you to be extra vigilant?

However, we are also aware that there are several professional dog walkers who bring dogs into the parish and we would like to assure you that we are endeavouring to find a way of encouraging them to follow your good example. We will be in consultation with the Parks Trust about additional signage but we are aware also that extra bins can be unsightly, they need emptying regularly and this puts up the operational cost of running the parish.

Did you know that dog faeces can be harmful to humans, especially children and that parasites and serious disease can be transmitted to livestock (sheep and cattle) via dog waste left in grazing areas. Please remove waste from all locations always, including grazing land, to minimize these risks.
