Get SET for summer

The team that brought the football club to Milton Keynes always intended to develop a robust, innovative and sustainable community legacy, and its **SET (Sports & Education Trust)** organises the delivery of that work in five main streams: Health, Education, Social Inclusion, Participation and Football Development. This gives the SET a breadth of operation that allows it to be an influential partner in many aspects of the local community. Each year over 50,000 adults and children benefit from activities such as the Premier League Primary Stars, disability sessions, health and employability programmes, team coaching, mini soccer



and multi sports programmes, as well as football development. These are delivered in partnership with a range of bodies including Milton Keynes Council, NHS: MK, schools, and junior football clubs. In 2018, the SET raised £1.4m

Woughton on the Green is the training ground for MK Dons FC and the Sports & Education Trust with most evening and weekend programmes being delivered out of this site. In the last calendar year 1600 young people & adults accessed the dome to take part in physical activity across our wide variety of programmes.

Memo from your PCSO

My name is Tracey Jones. I am a Police Community Support Officer for Thames Valley Police and I have the pleasure of serving you within your community. The role of a PCSO is to provide a visual presence on the street, to engage with people, groups and organisations. To sort problems, but also pass on skills so that others may do the same, enabling community resilience.



I started my training in May 2018 and was allocated Old Woughton as one of my areas in the August. I work a varying shift pattern, covering days, evenings and weekends. Whilst on patrol either in a vehicle, on foot or, more recently, on a bicycle I check on the allotments; play areas; the Pavilion; underpasses; really anywhere and everywhere! I challenge people using the car parks, especially late at night, I investigate suspicious vehicles/activity, I check on the vulnerable, as well as dealing with minor crime and assisting Police Officers with their enquiries. I also plan and run events, examples being: bike marking; burglary and car crime advice.

I have met some wonderful people already and know how hard you and your Parish Councillors work to maintain and improve your environment. A testament to this is that in the last 90 days there has only been 11 reported crimes.

However, should you have any concerns, events you would like to see or are aware of any, I will happily attend. Feel free to email me or even better, stop and speak when you see me around. Please remember to call either 999 or 101 before emailing crime related matters as I may not be on shift or readily available. Thank you for allowing me to introduce myself and my role. I look forward to seeing you out and about soon.

A Reader Writes

Re: Parish Parking

Dear Residents,

I am blind and a long cane user living in Old Woughton Parish.

Moving around safely on pavements is essential for me. I need to use pavements without worrying about obstacles that might be blocking the way.

Parked vehicles can cause a hazard and restrict my freedom to navigate the routes that I have learned to take safely.

I may collide with vehicles parked on pavements potentially causing me injury. If the vehicle does not leave enough space, or there are other obstacles, I may have to walk out into the road to be able to get past. This obviously means I will be at risk of being hit by other traffic.

Please consider the needs of wheelchair, pushchair and blind pedestrians when parking your vehicle.

My message is simple: "Please do not park on the pavement".

It is not just cars that cause obstructions to pavements. As summer progresses and the hedges at the front of all our gardens become overgrown, these can restrict free passage along public paths.



This can be compounded by tailing bramble growing through the hedges, which can be very dangerous for the blind and partially sighted. It is incumbent on all of us to ensure our hedges are trimmed and well maintained.

Canal Work Day 8th June 2019

A huge thank you to the Canal Workday Team and Laura from CaRT. On a very wet Saturday morning a further 3 tonnes of aggregate was laid on the canal tow path at the rear of Verley Close, filling ruts and improving worn areas of path.

We must thank The Parks Trust for helping us by moving the aggregate to our work location. Without access to a boat, this is the challenging part of our project getting resources to the canal-side.

There will be further workdays arranged – why not come and join us!



Thinking about Thanking' Milton Keynes
