Schools across Milton Keynes took part in a number of different activities during the Week.

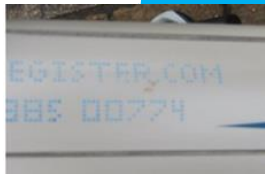
Some of the activities were: Bling your Bike, Bike Register, 1km ride in the quickest time, student's resistance challenge.
