



Wildfire and Outdoor Fire Safety.

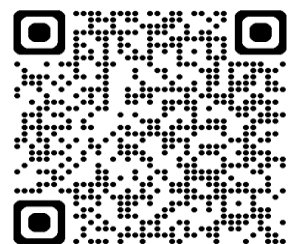
During dry weather, even a small outdoor fire can quickly develop into a serious incident. The Government have temporarily banned sales of disposable BBQs, which are considered unsafe.

You can help protect your community with these simple steps:

If you spot a wildfire

- ✓ Stay calm and move to a safe place away from flames and smoke
- ✓ **Call 999 and ask for the fire service.** Give as much information as possible: location, size, and direction if it is spreading
- ✓ Report arson to Crimestoppers on 0800 555 111

Important information:

Temporary ban on sales of disposable BBQs

The Government has issued guidance stating that disposable BBQs should not currently be sold because of the increased risk of wildfires during hot and dry weather.

Which products are affected?

Disposable BBQs that are designed for a single use and that are supplied ready to use with fuel included.

Does this apply to reusable BBQs?

No. The guidance applies to disposable BBQs only.

What happens if shops keep selling them?

Trading Standards will contact the store, and if necessary, will take action such as serving a Suspension Notice to stop further sales - or even take legal action.

Is this a permanent ban?

No. Government will review the measures as conditions change.

Does this apply to online sales?

Yes. Disposable BBQs should also be removed from sale while the current guidance is in force.
